

Catching Carnivores



Join Candid Critter Biologists for a series of live conversations about the carnivores of North Carolina, their natural history, where they are most common and how they are adapting to urbanization in our state.

Though you may not often see them, carnivores like coyotes, black bears, bobcats and foxes are common throughout North Carolina. Carnivores make up 10% of photos captured on North Carolina's Candid Critters cameras. These species appear to be occupying cities more and more, increasing potential impacts on urban prey species, and humans. Through examples of data collected by the North Carolina's Candid Critters project, we will discuss the distribution, behavior and ecology of these carnivore species in North Carolina and how they are adapting to city life.
